MORE LIBERAL METHODS OF TREATING INCOME  
UNDER SECTION 1902(R)(2) OF THE ACT

1. For all eligibility groups not subject to the limitations on payment explained in section 1903(f) of the Act\*: All wages paid by the Census Bureau for temporary employment related to Census 2000 activities are excluded.
2. For children under 1902(a)(10)(A)(i)(VI), income is excluded in the amount of the difference between 133 percent and 150 percent of the Federal Poverty Level (as revised annually in the Federal Register) by family size.
3. For children under 1902(a)(10)(A)(i)(VII), income is excluded in the amount of the difference between 100 percent and 150 percent of the Federal Poverty Level (as revised annually in the Federal Register) by family size.
4. For pregnant women under 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(IX) and 1902(l)(2), with incomes above 150 percent of the Federal Poverty Level, income is excluded in the amount of the difference between 150 percent and 200 percent of the Federal Poverty Level (as revised annually in the Federal Register) by family size.

\* more liberal methods may not result in exceeding gross income limitations under section 1903(f).

5. For targeted low income children under 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(XIV) of the Act, net countable income, calculated in accordance with the requirements at 42 CFR 435.601(b), 45 CFR 233.20 and 45 CFR 233.53 is excluded in the amount of the difference between 200% and 300% of the federal poverty level (as revised annually by the CPI-U in the Federal Register) by family size.

FOR THE TWWIIA COVERED GROUPS

1. For the purpose of determining whether an individual is eligible on the basis of income for Medicaid under section 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(XV) and (XVI) of the Social Security Act, only the individual's income is considered.
2. If the individual eligible for Medicaid under section 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(XV) or (XVI) of the Social Security Act has countable income exceeding two hundred fifty per cent of the FPL, an annual amount up to twenty thousand dollars of earned income shall be disregarded wholly or in part as needed on a monthly basis each year of eligibility.

X Wages paid by the Census Bureau for temporary employment related to census activities are excluded for the following eligibility groups:

- X Qualified children and pregnant women under 1902(a)(10)(A)(i)(III).
- X Poverty level pregnant women and infants (133 –185% FPL) under 1902(a)(10)(A)(i)(IV).
- X Poverty level children under age 6 (133% FPL) under 1902(a)(10)(A)(i)(VI).
- X Poverty level children under age 19 (100% FPL) under 1902(a)(10)(A)(i)(VII).

And the following optional categorically needy eligibility groups covered under 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii) of the Act.

- 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(IX) and 1902(l)(1)(A),
- 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(XIV),
- 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(IV),
- 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(I) and 1905(a)(i),
- 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(VIII),
- 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(XV), and
- 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(XVI).

- Medically Needy under 1902(a)(10)(C)(i)(III).
- X All aged, blind or disabled groups in 209(b) states under 1902(f).
- X QMBs, SLMBs and QIs under 1905(p).

And the following covered group:

1. Any individual qualifying for the TWWIA under sections 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(XV) and (XVI) of the Social Security Act.

*NOTE: The Special Income Level Group under 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(V), the Individuals Who Would be Eligible if In an Institution Group under 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(VI) and the Hospice Group under 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(VII) cannot be included in this disregard.*

MORE LIBERAL METHODS OF TREATING INCOME  
UNDER SECTION 1902(r)(2) OF THE ACT

For individuals under 1902 (a)(10)(A)(ii), 1905(a)(i), and 42 CFR 435.222:

Disregard the difference between the current payment standard specified below and the July 16, 1996 AFDC payment standard for the appropriate household size (as specified on Supplement 1 to Attachment 2.6-A, page 1). Subtract that difference from a family's net countable income, and compare the remaining income to the July 16, 1996 AFDC payment standard.

The agency applies higher income standards than those in effect as of July 16, 1996 increased by no more than the percentage increases in the Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) since July 1, 1996 as follows:

Number in Assistance Group	July 1996 AFDC Payment Standard	January 2010 Payment Standard
1	\$203	\$259
2	\$279	\$355

The payment standard adjusts annually beginning January 1, based upon the COLA made by the United States commissioner of social security under 42 U.S.C. 415(i) for benefits provided under Title II of the "Social Security Act of 1935."
