> Description

The National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) has published an update to the International Classification of Diseases, 10th Revision, Clinical Modification (ICD-10-CM) diagnosis codes, which will become effective October 1, 2016. In this, several thousand codes have been revised, added, or deleted. The Ohio Department of Medicaid has reviewed the updates to identify any current behavioral health diagnosis codes that may be impacted.

ODM's analysis found fourteen diagnosis codes (see the list below) that have been revised to either include additional digits for specificity or moved to a more appropriate disease classification/subcategory. These coding changes have been configured in the Ohio Medicaid claims system (MITS) and will be effective 10/1/2016. Claims for behavioral health services can be submitted with the new codes for dates of service 10/1/2016 and beyond.

NOTE: As of 10/1/2016, CMS no longer recognizes some of the previous codes (9/30/2016) as valid for billing, and therefore, the revised code must be reported. Some of the previous codes are still valid for billing and will be recognized on Medicaid claims in MITS. The chart below has been updated to reflect which codes are valid for billing.

To ensure compliance with ICD-10-CM requirements under HIPAA, providers should:

- Report ICD-10 codes that have been derived from documentation in the medical record
- Code to the highest level of specificity possible
- Use the most up-to-date ICD-10 code set
