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Medicaid's Quality Strategy Aims

- **Better Care:**

 - Improve the health of the Ohio Medicaid population by supporting proven interventions to address behavioral, social and, environmental determinants of health.

2014 MCP Performance Measures & P4P

- MCP Performance Measures
 - 25 Measures aligned with Medicaid's Quality Strategy
 - Measurement Year: **CY 2013**
 - Data Source: MCP self-reported audited HEDIS
 - Standard
 - Based on last year's NCQA national Medicaid percentiles
 - Minimum Performance Standard = **25th Percentile**
 - P4P – 6 Clinical Performance Measures designated as P4P measures
 - Method: Higher Performance = Higher Pay
 - Based on results of 6 clinical performance measures
 - Amount: 1% of premium
 - Standards:
 - Bonus starts above **25th percentile**
 - 1% awarded if at or above **90th percentile**

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





2014 P4P - Results by Measure




Diabetes: LDL-C Screening - 2014 P4P









Appropriate Use of Asthma Meds - 2014 P4P






Controlling High Blood Pressure - 2014 P4P






Timeliness of Prenatal Care - 2014 P4P



MCPs awarded \$4.6 million (39%) of \$12 million possible




Follow-up after MH Hospitalization (7day)- 2014 P4P






Follow-up after MH Hospitalization (7day) - 2014 P4P

Next Year - 2015 P4P

- P4P
 - Method: Higher Performance = Higher Pay
 - Based on results of 6 clinical performance measures
 - Amount: 1.25% of premium
 - Incentive dollars shifted to higher performance levels
 - Standards:
 - Bonus starts above 25th percentile
 - 1.25% awarded if at or above 75th percentile



Q&A

- How much money was awarded to MCPs through the P4P program in 2014?
 - \$17 million (22%) of a possible \$70 million
- How many years has this P4P program been in place?
 - Since 1/1/2012; the second year's results are available for review; the third year's results won't be available until 10/1/2015
- Is the incentive program working?
 - It is too early to tell. We only have two years to evaluate and there were significant changes in the second measurement year.
