## **Version 5010 and ICD-10**

Dear Trading Partners and Provider Partners:

On January 1, 2012, ODJFS began accepting Version 5010 files and over the past few weeks, several trading partners have successfully transitioned to 5010. All covered entities including trading partners and providers should complete the transition to Version 5010 as soon as possible and begin assessing their readiness for ICD-10. ODJFS will continue to work with trading partners and providers to achieve a successful transition from 4010 to 5010 by March 1, 2012.

The complete transition to Version 5010 is necessary to prepare for the implementation of the International Classification of Diseases, 10<sup>th</sup> Edition, Procedure Coding System/Clinical Modification (ICD-10-PCS/CM) on October 1, 2013.

CMS will require all covered entities to begin using diagnosis reporting with dates of service for outpatient, or dates of discharge for inpatient, that occur on or after October 1, 2013.

### **What are the major benefits to ICD-10?**

- Provides better data needed for measuring the quality, safety and efficacy of care;
- Reduces the need for attachments to explain the patient's condition;
- Improves clinical, financial, and administrative performance;
- Prevents and detects health care fraud and abuse;
- Improves the design of payment systems and processing claims for reimbursement
