Subject: Chapter 6 Rule Migration

This MEMTL contains five new rules from Chapter 5160:1-2 of the Administrative Code to replace five rescinded rules from Chapter 5160:1-1.

The effective date of the rules is August 1, 2016.

Chapter 1 General Medicaid Eligibility Policy

5160:1-1-51.2 Medicaid: Consumer Fraud and Erroneous Payments

This rule was rescinded and the language is found in new OAC rule 5160:1-2-04.

5160:1-1-51.4 Medicaid: Outstationing workers at disproportionate share hospitals and federally qualified health centers

This rule was rescinded and the language is found in new OAC rule 5160:1-2-06.

5160:1-1-58.2 Medicaid: United States (U.S.) citizenship documentation

This rule was rescinded and the language is found in new OAC rule 5160:1-2-11.

5160:1-1-58.3 Medicaid: non-citizens

This rule was rescinded and the language is found in new OAC rule 5160:1-2-12.

5160:1-1-63.2 Medicaid: continuous eligibility for children younger than age nineteen

This rule was rescinded and the language is found in new OAC rule 5160:1-2-14.

Chapter 2 Medicaid Application Processing

5160:1-2-04 Medicaid: Consumer Fraud and Erroneous Payments

This new rule replaces current rule 5160:1-1-51.2. Changes to the rule include a new rule number and updated references to rule numbers.

5160:1-2-06: Medicaid: Outstationing workers at disproportionate share hospitals and federally qualified health centers

This new rule replaces current rule 5160:1-1-51.4. Changes to the rule include a new rule number and updated references to rule numbers.

5160:1-2-11 Medicaid: United States (U.S.) citizenship documentation

This new rule replaces current rule 5160:1-1-58.2. Changes to the rule include a new rule number and updated references to rule numbers.

5160:1-2-12 Medicaid: non-citizens

This new rule replaces current rule 5160:1-1-58.3. Changes to the rule include removal of forms I-688A and I-688B (employment authorization documents) as verification of temporary evidence of lawful admission for permanent residence and employment authorization. The Department of Homeland Security and the Social Security Administration stopped accepting I-688A and I-688B in October of 2009 and January of 2010 respectively. The changes also include a new rule number and updated references to rule numbers.

5160:1-2-14 Medicaid: continuous eligibility for children younger than age nineteen

This new rule replaces current rule 5160:1-1-63.2. Changes to the rule include a new rule number and updated references to rule numbers.
